
Message from the Mountain 2019


like the bobcat licking its chops.







they sway in the breeze. Life at all stages has beauty.







<u>2019 06-21, 4256 - THE VIEW FROM THE PATH</u> - I paused along the new path I had recently cut at the edge of the Lupine Field to enjoy the beautiful flowers from a different angle. Nature is a great place to pause and get a different view of life situations that we encounter along our soul's path.



<u>2019 06-22, 4257 - A SPECIAL DISCOVERY</u> - As I approached an old pine stump at the edge of the Lupine Field, I discovered a small room someone had created to honor the fairies that I knew lived there. 

2019 06-30, 4265 - FROM FLOWER TO FRUIT - I noticed as I was photographing blackberry flowers that the tiny fruit had already started to form, and I was reminded how ideas in our minds start as tiny fruit that when grown to maturity have the opportunity to nourish many.

<u>2019 07-05</u>, <u>4270 - PROOF THAT SEEDS SPREAD</u> - I am grateful that the seeds from flowers I transplanted years ago have spread throughout the portions of our un-mowed lawn. Seeds, including acts of kindness, do spread if we take the risk of planting them.



<u>2019 07-06, 4271 - KEEPING MEMORIES ALIVE</u> - I have become aware over the years that listeners to this podcast often remember events in their own lives with fond recollections. The plants that came from my mother's gardens serve to remind me of positive experiences from the past.



<u>2019 07-07, 4272 - NOT FOR THE FAINT OF HEART</u> - I watched as the limb of a tree close to the house was trimmed by a climber tethered to a rope. The job was not for the faint of heart. Then again, there are many things along our path of life that take courage to take the risk of

succeeding.

<u>2019 07-13, 4278 - SWEET DELICACIES</u> - The wild strawberries are now gracing the field with their red colors. They are such a sweet delicacy, and I can remember when it was easy for me to bend over picking them for hours to get enough for wild strawberry shortcake. Now I just sample a few, leaving the rest for the birds.



<u>2019 07-14, 4279 - SUMMER WILDFLOWERS</u> - When the Lupine Field was first created, it began with raw earth that was seeded to grass, clover, and of course, lupine with a wildflower mix added in. Now, several years later, the field is brimming with wildflowers creating a beautiful relaxing place in Nature.

day to day life.






day.

colors, is a joy to see.






amazing how they grow.

When we think life has no definition to it, shades of white can open up the shades of life.



2019 12-12, 4430 - THE UPS AND DOWNS OF WINTER - This winter has had many ups and downs depending on how you view the weather. If you enjoy winter sports it is more of a downer and if you like less snow it is an upper. Regardless of the weather life itself has many special moments in it.



<u>2019 12-13, 4431 - A SHOCKING DISCOVERY</u> - I found it in the middle of the orchard, and I suspect that an animal or bird had left it there. It was a shocking discovery, partially eaten. I took a photo as I had no idea what it was or where it came from. Later, my wife informed me that it was a dog's toy. That's life.



<u>2019 12-14, 4432 - PEEKING DOW</u>N - When I stand at the top of the Lupine Field this time of year, I can peek down at the miniature lake and houses in the valley. It provides me a different view of life, and I become an observer. Even if I was in the valley, I could step back and imagine I am up on the mountain.



<u>2019 12-15, 4433 - FULL MOON AT DAWN</u> - When the moon is full and the sky is clear, our best view is just before dawn as it sets behind the mountains to the west. There is something about the moon that captures the imagination. A moment with the moon can change our lives.



<u>2019 12-16, 4434 - SATURATED</u> - The foothills are saturated with water due to heavy rains of the past few days. The ground can hold no more. People are also saturated with holiday events, food, and emotions. It won't be long before the holidays will be over and the ground covered with snow.



<u>2019 12-17, 4435 - A GOOD YEAR FOR BEECHNUTS</u> - By the looks of the empty shells on the ground, this has been a good year for beechnuts. They provide food to help the wild animals though the winter. The forest is also providing spiritual food to help us find gratitude for the days ahead.



<u>2019 12-18, 4436 - CONTRASTS</u> - Winter snows have had a hard time becoming established in the foothills this year. As I stood at the top of the Lupine Field, the bare ground was a sharp contrast with the winter white of the mountains. We live in a world of contrasts, and yet there is beauty in all.



<u>2019 12-19, 4437 - SPLASHES OF RED</u> - I have enjoyed being greeted with slashes of red intermingled with a brown landscape as I drive around. They are the festive berries that last through the holidays and bring color to life, and I am grateful to have them greet me.



<u>2019 12-20, 4438 - WINTER WONDERLAND</u> - A fresh coating of snow just before the winter solstice has turned the landscape into a winter wonderland. I can imagine what it would have been like to travel the old road in a horse drawn sleigh as I blend the past with the present. We are all pioneers.

Perhaps it's just discovering the power of gratitude flowing through my heart. That light shines all year long regardless of the day's length.



2019 12-25, 4443 MAGICAL - Christmas has been a magical day for me since I was a child. The magic has changed and now is experienced in the smiles of strangers and random acts of kindness. I still think of myself as a child and wonder what it would be like to experience this magic all year.



<u>2019 12-26, 4444 - SPRING IN DECEMBER</u> - I am not sure if there is a typical winter anymore. Sometimes we have a snow cover in October and sometimes not before January. This year it feels like spring in December, great for hiking, not for skiing on the trails. I just enjoy each day.

<u>2019 12-29, 4447 - MEASURING TIME</u> - The seasons, events and locations in Nature are a way for me to measure time. Currently, it is the return of Nature's ice sculpture show in the brook that flows down the mountain. One abstract appears to be a winged figure. I look forward to these moments in time.



<u>2019 12-30, 4448 - A BEAR WITH INSOMNIA</u> - The footprints crossing the trail were large and at first we weren't sure if they were animal or human. On further investigation we found them to be a bear with insomnia. Perhaps the changes in the climate have changed both humans and animals.



<u>2019 12-31, 4449 - WHEN THE LIGHT IS RIGHT</u> - A patch of green on a maple tree, illuminated by sunlight, caught my eye as I gazed out the window. It was moss and it looked like a bouquet.
