
<u>Message from the Mountain</u> 2020







We opened a wall and bought a very heavy 3" pine slab to become the new counter. The wood slab in now installed. It has been a great diversion.

I remember my father transporting the whole youth baseball team in our old station wagon, a love of the sport that survives in my grandson.



<u>2020 06-22, 4623 - SWEET SUMMER</u> - Now that summer has officially arrived, along with a heat wave, the flowers are in full bloom, including the sweet peas that I transplanted from my mother's house years ago. Seeing them again brings back positive memories of a different time.



<u>2020 06-23, 4624 - A SPECIAL ROSE FOR A SPECIAL DAY</u> - Today my wife and I are celebrating our 58th wedding anniversary. We don't feel as old as the years indicate, and I believe our love of Nature is one of the reasons that we still have something daily to discover.

<u>2020 07-05, 4636 - MORE SUMMER FUN</u> - My summer fun is centered around discovering different flowers that are blooming on the property. Every day there is usually something new to discover. Nature provides a wonderful opportunity to reflect on life in ways that can help shape our journey as we move forward.



<u>2020 07-06, 4637 - MILKWEED</u> - The milkweed flowers are currently providing nourishment in the orchard for the bees and butterflies. It is not the most attractive wildflower, and if you break the stem of one will coat your hand with a milky substance. Still, it is an important part of Nature. We all are.



<u>2020 07-07, 4638 - BROWN EYED SUSANS IN THE GRASS</u> - On a recent trip through the Lupine Field I noticed that the Brown Eyed Susans were in bloom. I photographed them through the tall grass and discovered an interesting blend of colors. Life is a blend of different colors that make up a beautiful diversity.



<u>2020 07-08, 4639 - THE LILY THAT KEEPS ON BLOOMING</u> - We have one ever-blooming daylily at the Center. It is a compromise between a true daylily and a flower that looks like a daylily that flowers all summer. I enjoy both varieties. There is something in most everything that can inspire us.



<u>2020 07-09, 4640 - HOSTA</u> - The hosta are blooming. It is a very interesting plant that does well in shade and has large green or variegated leaves with small blossoms. It is a favorite with deer who find it tasty. Still, it is very important in the whole scheme of Nature.



<u>2020 07-10, 4641 - GIANT MULLEIN</u> - The tall mullein are in bloom at the bottom of the Lupine Field. They seem to thrive in poor soil and are considered to be a weed by many and others make a medicinal tea out of its parts. It is interesting to me how people value differently the components of Nature.



<u>2020 07-11, 4642 - FOGGY JULY MORNING</u>- I find foggy July mornings mystical, no matter where I am. My mind drifts into adventures of the past and future as I drift from one thought to the next, all the time feeling a deep appreciation for the magic of Nature.



<u>2020 07-12, 4643 - ANOTHER HEART HUG FROM NATURE</u> - Every time I see a heart shape in Nature, such as in a cloud, or a leaf, or a rock on the ground, I know I am receiving something special. I send Nature mental hugs every day. I just love how everything is all connected.



<u>2020 07-13, 4644 - TREE IMAGES</u> - Over the years I have done many podcasts on the subject of images I see in the bark of trees. I could have passed by an image hundreds of times until it suddenly catches my attention. I realize that others may not see what I saw. Life has many different views.



<u>2020 07-14, 4645 - ENTERING THE MIST</u> - As I walked the trail leading to the Lupine Field I could see the fog and mist ahead through the opening in the trees. I knew that a magical world of the undefined was waiting. The landscape would look different giving me a different look of the world.



<u>2020 07-15, 4646 - RIPPLES</u> - Watching a ripple spread across calm water is mesmerizing to me. Soon the whole surface is covered with small waves. Think of your positive actions spreading like energy ripples across the landscape of life.



<u>2020 07-16, 4647 - RED HEAD</u> - I watched a large male turkey grub its way across the fresh cut lawn after a rain storm. Its feathers shined in the sunlight, especially its bright red head. I was not the only one taking notice. A hummingbird swooped in for a closer look. Nature is so amazing.



<u>2020 07-17, 4648 - WILD BLUEBERRIES</u> - We are fortunate to have wild blueberries growing on the mountainside. I have watched them since the first buds appeared in late spring, and now as the fruit is turning blue, look forward to blueberry muffins. Nature provides us with many treats both tasty and visual.



<u>2020 07-18, 4649 - A CLOUDY DAY</u> - Every once in a while during this hot dry summer we will get a cloudy day, one that hints of rain. It can be a welcome change and a chance to observe the world from a little different perspective. Any kind of day can present the opportunity to appreciate Nature.



<u>2020 07-19, 4650 - GLISTENING IN THE RAIN</u> - The pink daylily glistened in the rain. It stood out during this dull day. I thought of how car commercials wet down roads to help make the cars they are trying to sell stand out. I thought of people who glisten with positive energy as they shine their lights.

<u>2020 08-05, 4667 - BLUE WILDFLOWERS</u> - There is a constant transition taking place in the Lupine Field from the disappearance of snow in the spring until it returns again in late fall. Right now, the beautiful and graceful blue Ragged Robin is in bloom. My intention is to daily discover something new in life.



<u>2020 08-06, 4668 - THE STORM TRACKED TO THE WEST</u> - The tropical storm, just below hurricane strength, roared up the East Coast and tracked by where we live to the West. I listened to the call on the scanner of trees down throughout the area. By morning it was gone and the sun was shining again.



<u>2020 08-07, 4669 - MUSHROOM CHARACTER</u> - I have seen a lot of characters in Nature, from tree spirits to cloud faces to a mushroom characters. Each encounter provides an opportunity for my mind to embrace a story that may relate to a situation in life that I am experiencing.



<u>2020 08-08, 4670 - ANOTHER WILDFLOWER BOUQUET</u> - As I sat on the memory bench beside the Lupine Field I noticed a beautiful bouquet of wildflowers growing in a place where there was very little top soil. Nature was providing me with another gift to brighten my day. I am grateful.





<u>2020 08-26, 4688 - OCEAN DECORATIONS</u> - It is always fascinating when I visit Nature in other places. There is always something different at the ocean than here in the mountains. Even the air is different - fresh and salty. All one has to do is be aware of their surroundings.



<u>2020 08-27, 4689 - FINDING PEACE AT THE EDGE OF THE ORCHARD</u> - We placed a grouping of chairs at the edge of the orchard, a place where one can sit and observe Nature, to reflect, and find peace, both in the place and within one's self. Nature can provide special places to escape, if only for a few moments.



<u>2020 08-28, 4690 - WONDER IN NATURE</u> - I love to wonder what the land might have looked like in older times and who left imprints there. I wonder about a spot surrounded by ferns that looks like a potential spot for a pond. Wondering is a great way to be a kid again.



<u>2020 08-29, 4691 - SCAVENGER HUNT</u> - I have been on a scavenger hunt for most of my life, collecting parts and pieces of things I think I will have a use for in the future. I think many people have been doing the same thing spiritually and now are finding ways to dust off and reexamine unused abilities.



<u>2020 08-30, 4692 - FIRST VISITOR</u> - My wife and I set up a bird bath in a corner of the Peace Garden that is being designed by our granddaughter. I filled it with water, and later in the day I noticed that nuthatches had found it. They are the first visitors to the garden.



<u>2020 08-31, 4693 - BARK MONSTER</u> - Some people are afraid of the woods. They fear the unknown, whether it is dark spirits or wild animals. The bark clinging to a tree at first appearance looked to me like some sort of monster. Then again, life itself, when lived in fear, is much the same as fearing the woods.



<u>2020 09-01, 4694 - HAWK EYE</u> - I focus on the hawk that watches over us as we travel the old road again. I keep searching for the perfect photo and when I saw the magnificent bird of prey's sharp eye, I was reminded of how we have the opportunity to observe life through the eyes of Nature.

Many times we forget that important step in reaching our goals.



<u>2020 09-07, 4700 - PODCAST 4700 A LOT OF SUNRISES AND SUNSETS</u> - I have observed a lot of sunrises and sunsets, as well as many aspects of Nature, over the past fourteen years doing a daily podcast. It has taught me that the whole of life has many angles filled with insights.

There is a lot of unseen life around us.

On the way we passed a family on a hike and as we eventually headed back down we passed them having a picnic at the edge of the Lupine Field. It was a timeless image and good for the soul.

<u>2020 09-15, 4708 - GOING TO SEED</u> - Nature is casting seeds from many of its plants. The animals and birds have for the most part risen their young investing in the years to come. Now is a wonderful time during this harvest season to release the seeds of positive actions to nourish people everywhere.



<u>2020 09-16, 4709 - IN A DROUGHT</u> - We are in a major drought here in the foot hills. The little brook that flows by the house is bone dry. It will take a lot of rain to recover. Mind droughts, a least, can flow again through divine inspiration.



<u>2020 09-17, 4710 - RED APPLES</u> - The apples have turned red on the trees in the orchard and even though we don't eat these, they serve as a reminder to purchase some at a store to make pies and apple crisp. Nature provides us with many treats, some edible and some feasts for our eyes.



<u>2020 09-18, 4711 - LEFT OVER FROM LUNCH</u> - It appears that the squirrels had a good lunch, munching on a pine cone. They left a lot of debris on rocks and stumps. That debris will eventually nurture the forest soil. Animals often leave calling cards, letting others know they have been there.



<u>2020 09-19, 4712 - CLEAR AIR</u> - The feeling of fall is in the air which is coming from Canada at the moment causing clear views of the mountains across the valley. It is a wonderful time to visit a favorite spot in Nature and take a few minutes to reflect and plan for the fall ahead.



<u>2020 09-20, 4713 - CHANGES ARE COMING</u> - You can feel it in the air. You can see it in the changing leaves. It is only a matter of weeks before the mountains will be ablaze with the colors and smells of fall. Nature will be ready and waiting for you to pay her a visit.



<u>2020 09-21, 4714 - LOOKING AT THE LAKE THROUGH RED OAK LEAVES</u> - There are many different views of fall to capture, from large panoramas to small groupings of colorful subjects. Life is a collection of large views and small views that make up the whole picture.
