experience Nature up close and personal.





was on the right path and that I was not alone. It was a good feeling.





<u>2021 03-07, 4881 - AN OLD BIRD'S NEST IN WINTER</u> - I recently discovered an old bird's nest beside a trail I walk all year and had probably passed by when the bird was raising its young. In life we may discover something about others that we didn't know when seeing them from a different perspective.



<u>2021 03-08, 4882 - A MARCH AFTERNOON</u> - March is one of my favorite times of year. The sun is getting stronger every day, helping late winter outside activities to be even more enjoyable. Even though the cold may not be done yet, there is now an excitement in the air for the coming spring.



<u>2021 03-09, 4883 - AN UNPLOWED ROAD</u> - Once the snow cover on the road to the cabin has become deep enough to make driving it impossible, we resort to hiking or snowshoeing to go for our winter walks. Actually, what seems like an obstacle is really an opportunity to explore different ways to get to our destination.



2021 03-10, 4884 - THE CRUNCH OF WALKING ON LEAVES IN WINTER - Now that the beech and oak leaves have just about all fallen as the trees get ready for new growth, the snowshoe path crunches under my feet. I feel like a kid as I swish along wondering how far the sound travels. Spring!!!!



<u>2021 03-11, 4885 - A WINTER VISIT TO THE GRACE TRAIL</u> - Even though we have had a snowy winter, it is a joy to see how many people visit the land, including the Grace Trail at the Center. There they can leave behind a note with their worries on it.



<u>2021 03-12, 4886 - A PINK SUNSET</u> - I am not sure if it is my perception or if the sunsets and sunrises lately have been more brilliant. A pink sunset can help create a peaceful night and manifest the next day filled with positive adventures



<u>2021 03-13, 4887 - A PEACEFUL PEACE GARDEN</u> - Even in the winter, when the benches are covered with snow and the little pond is frozen over, there is something very peaceful about the Peace Garden. It waits patiently for the spring and the visitors that will be coming to ring the bell for peace.



<u>2021 03-14, 4888 - NATURE DESIGNS A CANOE</u> - Early in the winter a heavy wet snow storm caused a large pine limb to break. Now as the snow is beginning to melt, the limb looks like a canoe. It is a gift for my mind, allowing it to sail away for great adventures.

<u>2021 03-16, 4890 - SAPSICLES</u> - During this season of unpredictable weather, where one day it is spring and the next day is winter, the flow of sap in the maple trees sometimes flows easily or it might freeze at the spigot to create a sapsicle. If I were younger, I would choose one to taste. It is almost spring!



<u>2021 03-17, 4891 - NATURE CELEBRATES WITH GREEN</u> - Nature is celebrating St. Patty's Day with a display of green moss on the stumps and green evergreen trees. In fact, Nature provides a

reason to celebrate every day all year long.



<u>2021 03-18, 4892 - WALKING ON THE CRUST</u> - It is a rare occasion when the snow has compacted and then refrozen, making it possible to walk on the crust a couple of feet above the ground. It is a chance to view the world a little differently. Every day has something special.



<u>2021 03-19, 4893 - IN BETWEEN</u> - The little brook flowing by my window caught my attention recently with the beautiful frozen edges and flowing water in the center. It was another example of our being in between the seasons. By mid-day the ice melted and I knew we were experiencing the hope of spring.



<u>2021 03-20, 4894 - READY FOR NEW GROWTH</u> - The birch trees are growing new bark and as it is formed, the old bark begins to split and the wind helps unwind it from the tree. People are also having the chance to shed their old paradigms and embrace their new growth during this time of change.



<u>2021 03-21, 4895 - TIME TO CLEAN HOUSE</u> - It is time to clean the birdhouses out before the next groups of renters arrive for the late spring and early summer. Usually there is a lot of drama with the bluebirds fighting with the swallows for occupancy. People are also cleaning house in many ways.



<u>2021 03-22, 4896 - A GOLDEN SUNSET</u> - On the first day of spring we drove an hour to get our second Covid vaccination shot. Then that afternoon we went on a walk in the fresh spring air. As the sun was setting, the horizon turned golden. It was a golden day with great promise of a golden future.



<u>2021 03-23, 4897 - THE REWARD OF THE HIKE</u> - Every time I take a hike in Nature there is usually a reward waiting along the way: a bench with a view, a pleasant smell, or recently, sitting in the sun for a few moments.



<u>2021 03-24, 4898 - THE MELT IS ON</u> - It is mud season: that time of year when the frost is coming out of the ground creating a lot of mud. It is also the signal that the growing season is just about here with warmer days and the time to bring our winter dreams to reality.

- I am always on the lookout for hearts, whether in Nature or anywhere else. When I saw a heart- shaped mud puddle I smiled and knew that it was a sign from beyond.



<u>2021 03-28, 4902 - THE RUSH OF SPRING</u> - The little brook outside my window is filled to the brim with water from the melting snow as it rushes on to the rivers and lakes and finally the ocean, Covid winter.



2021 03-29, 4903 - SPRINGING UP - The signs of spring are everywhere, and the daffodils are peeking up through the ground. It won't be long before the landscape will be colored by their

yellow blooms. This year I find that spring has a very special meaning of hope.



<u>2021 03-30, 4904 - CLUES FROM THE PAST</u> - From time to time, when we explore the Reflection Center land, we discover clues from the past. Recently I discovered a large pine tree growing around two strands of barb wire. There was a pasture here in the early 1800s. Our souls also give us clues of our past.



<u>2021 03-31, 4905 - THE FIRST FLOWERS OF SPRING</u> - I was recently greeted by a tiny splash of sunshine from the yellow crocus flowers that survived the winter to bloom another year. I so look forward to the first flowers of spring and know that other varieties will provide inspiration all summer long.



<u>2021 04-01, 4906 - THE COLOR OF PURPLE</u> - Over the years I have learned that the color purple has special meaning to a lot of people. Some consider it a healing color and others think of it as spiritual. When the purple crocus bloomed, I was reminded it represented the healing energy that Nature gives us.



2021 04-02, 4907 - A TINY HEART IN THE LUPINE FIELD - Now that most of the snow has melted on the Lupine Field, we cleaned the rest of the bird houses, and as I was inspecting the land, I came upon a section that was just ledge; in the middle, was a tiny heart. Nature blessed the land.



2021 04-03, 4908 - A DIFFERENT WAY TO LOOK AT THE WORLD - Recently my daughter gave me a glass ball used by photographers to capture a different image of their subject. Through the ball the image appears round and upside down. Each person sees the world differently; that may help my view change.



<u>2021 04-04, 4909 - EASTER LILIES</u> - Today I celebrate Easter as well as the resurrection of spring. We have an Easter lily blooming on a table on the balcony of the great room. It is like bringing Nature inside while observing it through a picture window. Sometimes we look to the outside to see our insides.



<u>2021 04-05</u>, <u>4910 - PUSSY WILLOWS</u> - The other day I spent a little time with some of my favorite spring treats, pussy willows. Their fuzzy blooms almost cause me to try and pat them like a kitten, but instead, I focused on their details. Often we miss the little details in life that are so important.

It is a time to appreciate the indoor colors like lilies and potted mums. It is also a great time to let your inner light brighten the world.



<u>2021 04-08, 4913 - IMPATIENTLY WAITING</u> - As a child I impatiently waited for special days, and I still find that a part of me impatiently waits for the daffodils to bloom and the leaves to open, as I impatiently waiting for the pandemic to lessen its grip on our lives. Soon!!!



<u>2021 04-09, 4914 - SKY MOODS</u> - This time of year, before the leaves block my window view of the sunsets and sunrises, I attempt to be aware of the moods of the sky, from peaceful to bright colors, to sunsets with dark and light contrasting colors. No moment is the same, we often miss them.



<u>2021 04-10, 4915 - A SPECIAL VISITOR</u> - For two days in a row we have had a very special feathered visitor eating birdseed on a feeder and on the ground among the sprouting day lilies. It is a male cardinal, a rarity for us. We consider it to be a special sign from Nature and our angels that we are on the right path.



<u>2021 04-11, 4916 - SPECIAL DELIVERY</u> - We have a mailbox outside the Cabin, set there a few years ago as a joke because there is no mail service on the old road. The other day, the flag on the box was up, and inside were two hearts, carefully placed, one made out of birch bark. We enjoy sharing our love for the land with others.



2021 04-12, 4917 - WORTH THE WAIT - Finally, I was greeted by a large cheery yellow bouquet of daffodils. It seems as if I have been waiting for weeks, and now I know spring is really happening. It is a wonderful feeling this year, far different from last year. I am discovering life again.



2021 04-13, 4918 - MAYFLOWERS - Now that the daffodils have opened, I am happy to discover mayflowers in bloom. There is something very special about their delicate smell that causes me to pause and take a deep breath from a bouquet of them my wife places by the kitchen window. We

all need to pause for a moment.



2021 04-14, 4919 - NESTLED IN THE LEAVES - Before the trees develop new leaves, the old ones lying on the ground captured my attention and on a walk recently there, nestled in the leaves, was a tiny heart. I smiled, felt loved, and took a photo to share. I am always grateful for hearts.



<u>2021 04-15, 4920 - THE FORSYTHIA ARE GLOWING</u> - Spring is now in its golden glow period with the forsythia joining the daffodils to brighten the landscape. Although that show only lasts a couple of weeks, you have an inner glow that shines even brighter and lasts all year long.



<u>2021 04-16, 4921 - THE LUPINES ARE GROWING</u> - It seems as though every day now, there is something new and exciting to report as spring continues its march towards summer. Recently I checked on the Lupine Field and saw tiny lupine plants growing. In a month or so, we will celebrate their blooms.



<u>2021 04-17, 4922 - APRIL IS STILL FOOLING AROUND</u> - Just when the daffodils and forsythias are coming into full bloom, April plays the fool again, pelting the landscape with a fresh coat of snow. I know and am grateful for the moisture which is really needed, but the plants may not recover. It's just life.



<u>2021 04-18, 4923 - NOT THE LILAC BLOSSOMS I EXPECTED</u> - I stopped to check on a lilac bush in the middle of a recent snow storm. I had been watching the buds grow, anticipating the fragrant blossoms in May. What I saw were tiny snow balls in place of the flowers. Not what I expected, but still, a beautiful sight.



<u>2021 04-19, 4924 - CLOSE TRIM</u> - It is the time of year when people usually begin to spruce up their landscapes. We trimmed the apple trees, on Marginal Way walk, I found a very close Forsythia trim, and my son-in-law, like many others, just got a close overdue covid trim.



2021 04-20, 4925 - GOOD FOR THE LUNGS & GOOD FOR THE SOUL - There is nothing like a walk along the shore of the ocean with a fresh wind bringing the salty smell of the sea, cleansing our lungs and our soul, taking us back in time to memories we may not have known in our conscious minds.



<u>2021 04-21, 4926 - SALVAGING THE DAFFODILS AFTER THE SNOW STORM</u> - It seems every year, just after the daffodils bloom, a spring snow storm knocks them down. This year my wife salvaged the blossoms and created a beautiful bouquet that we can admire. There are a lot of things in life we can salvage.



<u>2021 04-22, 4927 - POLLEN SEASON</u> - Pollen season is taking place. My nose knows it, and before long the ponds will have a green film on their surfaces, and the air will be saturated with dust from pines and junipers and many other trees. In time, this season will move on to the next season of life.



<u>2021 04-23, 4928 - TWISTS AND TURNS</u> - Looking out the window by my desk, I see the little brook twisting and turning down the mountain. I see a large oak tree with limbs all twisted as it has been shaped by Nature into an intricate design. I think of life with all its twists and turns.



<u>2021 04-24, 4929 - TREASURE HUNTING</u> - I have been interested in treasure hunting since I was a kid and my father told me that he had buried a chest on the mountain when he was young, across from where he lived. I never did find it, but ever since, I look for items and people that I consider treasures, like an old ice chest.



<u>2021 04-25, 4930 - FILLING IN THE BLANK SPOTS</u> - Last year we built a stone wall around the remnants of a flower garden and planted a few bulbs that recently produced flowers. Our goal now is to begin to fill in the blank spots with other flowers. We do the same in life.



<u>2021 04-26, 4931 - THE WOODS CAN BE A SCARY PLACE</u> - The woods can be a scary place to people who fear encounters with wild animals or getting lost or the unknown. If we run from fear, we may never understand what we are afraid of. If we study it, we may find there is nothing to fear.



<u>2021 04-27, 4932 - SPRING IS PROGRESSING SLOWLY</u> - Maybe I'm a little impatient that spring has not arrived as fast as I would like. The land is still wet and the leaves have not opened fully. Still, there is a lot of beauty to take in every day as our lives move forward at the right pace.



<u>2021 04-28, 4933 - FINDING PEACE WITH THE DAFFODILS</u> - Last fall we planted about a hundred daffodil bulbs in various places, including a healthy amount in the Peace Garden with the hope of early color in the spring. The color is here now and the beautiful flowers help create a peaceful spot to reflect and regroup.

now budded and ready to blossom.



<u>2021 04-30, 4935 - BIRD WATCHING</u> - I love to watch the birds come and go to our feeders all year long, and in the spring I like to see what variety is raising their young in the bird houses in the Lupine Field. Recently I sat on the Memory Bench and watched a pair of swallows and a bluebird each staking out their spot.



<u>2021 05-01, 4936 - HONORING THE JACKSONS</u> - In the early 1800s, the Daniel Jackson family settled the land on the back side of our mountain, and we pass by the family graveyard on the way to the cabin. To honor the family we are slowing restoring the site that has fallen into disrepair over the years.



<u>2021 05-02, 4937 - READY FOR A FLAG</u> - The old pine tree growing on top of the mountain just above the Lupine Field has lost most of its limbs to the weather over the years. When I stand under it, I can imagine it as a flag pole waiting for a flag. In the meantime it stands tall as it watches over the landscape.



<u>2021 05-03, 4938 - MAPLE FLOWERS</u> - The maples are in full bloom. The leaves will appear as the seeds for future trees drop to the ground. The flowers may not be as brilliant as the fruit

trees, but they help brighten the lives that take the time to notice.



2021 05-04, 4939 - IS ANYONE MISSING A SHOE? - You never know what you might discover when walking the trails on the Mountain, including dog toys such as tennis balls, stuffed toys, bones from the butchers, or even shoes. The views and birds and animals are also different ask time as well as your own including

each time as well as your own inspirations.



<u>2021 05-05, 4940 - AN ENCOUNTER ON THE TRAIL</u> - After spending a couple of hours on trail maintenance, we slowly drove down the Mountain in our side-by-side when a large bird few in front of us, landing on a limb over the trail. It was a barred owl. You never know what you might encounter next in Nature.



<u>2021 05-06, 4941 - READY FOR A PICNIC</u> - The antique metal lawn furniture has been taken out of the storage shed and is now in place behind the cabin waiting for a picnic. It is one of our favorite summer activates on a warm evening looking out at the Orchard feeling the incredible energy of Nature.



<u>2021 05-07, 4942 - PRIMROSES</u> - This past week the tiny primroses have brought their bright smiles to the landscape. I may transplant some to the Cabin's and Center's gardens to share with people passing by. Primroses remind me of people who share their smiles and positive energy.



<u>2021 05-08, 4943 - A PEAR TREE IN BLOOM</u> - Our old pear tree is in full bloom. We do not get much edible fruit, but it sure helps us celebrate spring. This year spring is very special as we all find out what it is like to grow in the world again.



2021 05-09, 4944 - SO MUCH FOR THAT TREE - I often get a glimpse of them as they fly from tree to tree, after they have given a warning sound by rubbing their legs together, but I seldom catch them long enough to get a good picture. I did capture this one tearing apart an old birch

tree. How do they know where the bugs are?



2021 05-10, 4945 - IT IS A CARDINAL YEAR - We have often admired cardinals, but they seldom visited our feeders until this year when it seems a pair has taken up residency somewhere near enough so they visit in the early morning or evening. It is a wonderful gift from Nature that

warms our hearts with gratitude.



<u>2021 05-11, 4946 - EVEN THE ANT HILLS ARE WATCHING</u> - When one is alone in Nature, it is not uncommon to feel not alone, that something is watching them. That can be fearful for many unfamiliar with the positive aspects of Nature. I was reminded of this by an ant hill that looked like it had eyes.



<u>2021 05-12, 4947 - CREATING A NEW PATH</u> - Recently, while cleaning up the winter debris in the Enchanted Pathway, my wife decided it was time for a new path. With love she carefully created a little walk that we outlined in red sawdust. Now it is ready for children of all ages.



<u>2021 05-13, 4948 - MOUNTAIN ASH, A SPECIAL TREAT</u> - At the bottom of the Lupine Field I spotted a small tree full of yellowish white flowers. It stood out, and I wondered what it was and how it got there. It is a special treat I believe to be Mountain Ash. Nature always has a surprise for me.



<u>2021 05-14, 4949 - A HEART NEAR THE WOOD PILE</u> - The other day I noticed a rock shaped heart in the ground close to the wood pile in the back of the Cabin. I love finding heart signs that seem to appear at just the right time to inspire my heart to feel gratitude and unconditional love.



<u>2021 05-15, 4950 - STILL WHITE</u> - It is the middle of May and the top of Mount Washington is still covered with snow. Looking at it from the top of the Lupine Field, it stands high above the greening valley. From here, the whole Cosmos feels alive with the energy of all that is.



<u>2021 05-16, 4951 - TINY BLUET BEAUTIES</u> - A few years ago, as an afterthought while transplanting some plants to the Center, I grabbed a shovel full of some tiny flowers. Now we have several patches, and they are spreading each year with beautiful blue and white blossoms. I'm glad I listened to my inner guidance.



2021 05-17, 4952 - WAITING FOR COMPANY - A few years ago, on a trip to Pennsylvania, we purchased a little girl statue for the Fairy Pathway. Now she waits patiently in front of the

gazebo for children of all ages to discover the magic along the pathway.



<u>2021 05-18, 4953 - ONE OF MY FAVORITE SMELLS</u> - Finally, the lilacs have started to bloom. I have been waiting all year for their sweet delicate aroma. As I do not reproduce smell memories in my mind, my experiences with the lilacs relies on in the moment encounters, and that I intend to do while they bloom.



<u>2021 05-19, 4954 - NOT FORGOTTEN</u> - The forget-me-nots are anticipated each spring as the plants have spread rapidly over a portion of the lawn creating a cascading sea of beauty. Each different flower throughout the season carries with it a cascade of memories relating to the

plants. They are not forgotten.



<u>2021 05-20, 4955 - TAKING OVER THE FROG POND</u> - The little frog pond beside the Center has been taken over by beautiful flowering water plants. I wonder if our positive intentions and acts of love were to spread the same way that these plants have spread, what the difference in the world would be.



2021 05-21, 4956 - APPLYING THE LAW OF ATTRACTION - I witnessed Nature applying the law of attraction on our front law a couple of days ago when a lone male turkey strutted and issued calls to attract a female. Humans attract what they focus on whether they want it or not. Be careful.



<u>2021 05-22, 4957 - LOADED</u> - The old apple tree is loaded with blossoms this year. I pruned it and the others in the orchard earlier this spring with intention of giving them the opportunity to bear fruit. Sometimes people need to clear away their clutter to give themselves a chance to grow again.

Our game camera has captured pictures of animals I never see. Recently I became aware that I was being watched by swallows nesting in the orchard. I gave them a lot of space,

<u>2021 05-24, 4959 - A SURPRISE IN THE FLOWER GARDE</u>N - The previous owner of the Cabin dug up most of the plants in the flower garden when we took ownership. Recently I was trying to see if I could find any that might have been left when I spotted four lady slippers in bloom.

Nature is approving us.



<u>2021 05-25, 4960 - PACKED</u> - In the winter we enjoy the bright lights from round globes we hang from our windows that brighten the dark nights. The beautiful globe-like blossoms, packed with tiny flowers on a bush at the center, seem to glow in the daylight, brightening up the environment.





<u>2021 05-29, 4964 - READY FOR A WEDDING</u> - The bridal wreath is in full bloom, ready for a wedding. It is an old fashioned shrub that may not be as popular as it once was. Still it is beautiful and a great backdrop for a wedding party. To me it symbolizes the beginning of the summer season.



<u>2021 05-30, 4965 - IT WON'T BE LONG</u> - The lupines are beginning to bloom. It won't be long before the field will have a wonderful display of beautiful wildflowers outlined by the mountains across the valley. Nature puts on such a wonderful show for us to see if we take a moment and appreciate.



<u>2021 05-31, 4966 - A PLACE TO AVOID THE BUG</u>S - We are in the middle of black fly season to be followed by mosquitos that will pursue us all the way through fall. To help us connect to the joy that Nature provides, we erected a screen house near the Cabin where we can view the world in peace.



2021 06-01, 4967 - GENTLE RAIN - A day or two of gentle rain has gone a long way to bring relief to the drought we have been experiencing. When it rains too hard the water just washes away rather than being absorbed by the ground. Gentle persistent positive communication often works well with others.



2021 06-02, 4968 - SAILOR'S DELIGHT - There is an old rhyme about the weather I learned as a child that ends with the words, "Sailor's delight", indicating a red sky at night would bring good weather the following day. 

Then I look for signs of new growth and finally the show has arrived. I am so grateful to be connected to this special place and share it with the world if only in pictures.



<u>2021 06-06, 4972 - RHODIES</u> - The rhododendron are in bloom at the Center. They bring a lot of bright color to the landscape and are a joy to see for the people that walk the land. The intention is that all that experience the performance will take the positive energy with them to share with others.



<u>2021 06-07, 4973 - PURPLE COLUMBINE</u> - There is one single purple columbine growing in the stonewall garden at the Center. It reminds me of the intricate designs Nature creates in plants and all living creatures, including people. Every one of use has a design that is different from any other.



<u>2021 06-08, 4974 - BLUE FLAG</u> - The blue flags are now flying around the property as we continue to celebrate the arrival of warm weather as summer fast approaches. I am reminded of random acts of kindness people share with others. Nature is doing the same thing as she shares beautiful blue flags.



<u>2021 06-09, 4975 - THE FIRST DAYLILIES OF THE SEASON</u> - Lately I have been greeted each morning with the yellow blossoms of the first daylilies of the season. We transplanted those years ago from the Center where they were growing wild. They have the same freedom here.



<u>2021 06-10, 4976 - NATURE'S WILD ASTER GARDEN</u> - Nature has again given us a wild aster garden that surrounds one of the apple trees in the orchard. I pass by this beautiful blanket of flowers on my way to the Lupine Field. It should last into the fall, giving me reason to pause often and feel grateful.



2021 06-11, 4977 - SHAPED BY ITS ENVIRONMENT - I paused on a recent walk to photograph a mushroom that had grown close to a large rock. The rock made it impossible for the mushroom to mature with a round top. People are shaped by their environment, but at least they have the opportunity to reshape their minds.



<u>2021 06-12, 4978 - LUPINE AT THEIR PEAK</u> - The Lupine have been at their peak for a couple of days, and so, with our daughter, we visited them again. She took some beautiful pictures, kneeling down in the grass in a position my knee does not like. Her result was perfect, something people often have trouble finding.



<u>2021 06-13, 4979 - A ROSE FOR JUNE</u> - I am not the best at growing roses. I planted one in a semi-shaded spot several years ago and this year it has beautiful red flowers. I am reminded of people that suddenly allow their talents to bloom after several years of being dormant.



2021 06-14, 4980 - THE WILD LAWN - This year our lawn mowing person retired after many years, so we got a riding lawn mower. I am not as thorough a mower and am discovering wildflowers growing where the grass used to be cut. I am taking pleasure in finding unexpected beauty.



<u>2021 06-15, 4981 - DIGGING DEEP</u> - When I walk the trails, I see old stumps that have been toppled over by animals searching for food and deep holes dug into trees by woodpeckers, I am reminded that sometimes we need to dig a little deeper in life to find nourishment for our souls.



<u>2021 06-16, 4982 - THE QUEEN HAS ARRIVED</u> - I am surrounded by royalty. Now Queen Anne is holding court with her delicate white flowers bouncing in the wind. Nature doesn't care about our social standings. She welcomes one and all that come to admire her. Everyone is royalty to her.



<u>2021 06-17, 4983 - IN THE FOOTSTEPS OF COLE AND CHAMPNEY</u> - I recently had the pleasure of introducing a gifted artist friend to the Lupine Field. She spent the day painting the landscape, and I thought back to nearly two hundred years ago when Thomas Cole painted the great wilderness. It continues.



<u>2021 06-18, 4984 - REDISCOVERING AN OLD FASHIONED SUMMER</u> - I am sort of rediscovering what my summers used to be before the pandemic. I love to see the wildflowers growing beside the stone walls and the red rose that is loaded with blooms. It is a time to rediscover life again.



<u>2021 06-19, 4985 - FROM THE BACK OF A PARADE MAGAZINE</u> - Over fifty years ago my parents bought us a package of flowering shrubs from an ad on the back of a Parade Magazine. Three or so still survive, including a single mock orange that keeps spreading. Imagine our positive actions over time.



<u>2021 06-20, 4986 - DOUBLE THE PLEASURE</u> - Besides a single mock orange we still have a double mock orange planted over fifty years ago. Its small blossoms are fuller than the single. I still get great pleasure from this old shrub and I think of how many people that visit old flower gardens still enjoy their beauty.



<u>2021 06-21, 4987 - FOXGLOVE DISPLAY</u> - I had been keeping an eye out for foxgloves, had not seen any until I discovered one behind a lilac bush, and then as I was preparing to dump some brush, I discovered a foxglove display just out of sight. Nature always has a treat for us if we stay aware.





<u>2021 06-27, 4993 - REDISCOVERING A PINK ROSE</u> - I could see a pink blossom from the window that looks out on a neglected flower garden. It was a pink rose my sister gave me years ago. I will clear away the growth around it and maybe transplant it to a better place.



<u>2021 06-28, 4994 - VISITING THE PAST</u> - Recently on a short trip to the coast of Maine, we visited places that my wife used to visit over sixty years ago, including the lighthouse on Pemaquid Point. It was great to visit old places that were being kept up and improved for the future.



2021 07-06, 5002 - THERE IS SOMETHING ABOUT OCEAN AIR AND FLOWERS - I have noticed over the years that flowers on the coast seem to be bigger and very fragrant. I love to see roses in that environment and I wonder about people living in environments where they flourish. For me, there is something about the mountains.



<u>2021 07-07, 5003 - WOOD LILIES</u> - A friend sent me a photo of some wild lilies growing in the Lupine Field. We went to investigate and sure enough, a splash of red greeted me as I spied the wood lilies growing with a backdrop of beautiful mountains. I was grateful this beautiful flower had

chosen this place to bloom.



<u>2021 07-08, 5004 - SETTLING IN</u> - The hydrangeas I transplanted about six years ago at the Center are finally settling in and now produce several white blossoms. It often takes a while for shrubs to adapt to their new environment. It sometimes takes people a while for a change to settle into their unconscious mind.



2021 07-09, 5005 - A VERY SPECIAL WILD ROSE - I had been watching and hoping I would see it again this year. With the drought I wasn't sure it would be back, but then I saw two tiny pink blossoms. That rose has bloomed there yearly since my wife's father passed over twenty years

ago. It is a special rose.



<u>2021 07-10, 5006 - A DELICATE ASTILBE</u> - There is a flower in the gardens at the Center that appears to be very delicate and yet it is hardy. I am reminded when I see it of random acts of kindness that may not be flashy, but at the same time are hardy and just may take root, leading to other simple kindness acts.



<u>2021 07-11, 5007 - FENCE JUMPERS</u> - I have several plants and shrubs on the property that I call fence jumpers. They do not always stay where I plant them. One such shrub is the pink spirea. A few years ago I dug some up from over the stone wall where they had moved. People can

be fence jumpers, never happy where they are.



<u>2021 07-12, 5008 - WILD RASPBERRY BLOSSOMS</u> - This time of year I sometimes find pink wild raspberry blossoms in places I would not expect to see them. From its shape there is no clue as to what the fruit will look like. To me, they are unique and beautiful as are many discoveries that life provides for us.



<u>2021 07-13, 5009 - A PEACH OF A LILY</u> - There is a special peach colored lily in a garden at the Center. I love its color and I am reminded that peaches are considered a special fruit. Both peaches and this lily also remind me of special people. Wherever we go we are always reminded of people we have encountered.



<u>2021 07-14, 5010 - SHARING A BOUQUET</u> - We were recently given a beautiful bouquet of blue hydrangea blossoms by our neighbor with a gifted green thumb. It reminded me that when I share a photo, I consider it a bouquet of Nature. Any time we do random acts of kindness we are sharing a bouquet of love.



<u>2021 07-15, 5011 - HEART TO HEART</u> - Every time I find and photograph a heart in Nature, I feel as if I am sharing a positive message of love and gratitude from Nature that is being delivered to the hearts of those that tune into the podcast. I am just in between, experiencing this incredible flow of energy.



<u>2021 07-16, 5012 - BLUEBERRY SEASON</u> - They may be a little early this year because of the recent drought, but now with the much appreciated rain, blueberry season has arrived. It is also the season to re-connect to an old fashioned summer full of warmth and love and the hugs we have longed for.



<u>2021 07-17, 5013 - A LILY OF A SUMME</u>R - Day lilies themselves do not last a long time, but with enough different varieties they can be appreciated all summer long. I smile every time I pass by one of their blooms. It truly is an old fashioned summer to me.



<u>2021 07-18, 5014 - FEEDING THE BUTTERFLIES</u> - I paused while I was traversing the lower part of the Lupine Field to observe the butterflies feasting on the ragged robin that are now in bloom. Nature not only feeds the butterflies but also the souls of all those that visit her.



2021 07-19, 5015 - FUZZY SUMAC - The sumac are now in bloom with their long, fuzzy looking blossoms. It is a very invasive plant, popping up in places where the soil is raw as it spreads rapidly. It has brilliant red leaves and fruit in the fall. There are all kinds of people from "fuzzy"

to "rough" making up the landscape of life.



<u>2021 07-20, 5016 - HOSTA FLOWERS</u> - The hosta plant produces large green leaves and one would expect to see large flowers. The reality is that their flowers are very small, and, although beautiful, may not live up to expectations. There are people who promise big things that seem to

fade as time progresses.



<u>2021 07-21, 5017 - ALIVE AGAIN</u> - The little brook has come alive again with water flowing down the mountain. It was bone dry just a few weeks ago and with the summer rains it now brings nourishment to the soil as it passes by. People are beginning to feel alive again as they rediscover life after the pandemic.



<u>2021 07-22, 5018 - DOUBLE THE PLEASURE</u> - The double orange day lilies have begun to bloom. This year these lilies are a welcome reminder of a normal summer.

to tap into our own creativity.



<u>2021 07-24, 5020 - PHLOX SEASON</u> - I have found that I have developed the habit of breaking the year down into many different seasons. Also it is done by celebrating holidays with lights and outdoor decorations. In the summer the flowers decorate their own seasons, such as the phlox season.



2021 07-25, 5021 - MUSHROOMS ARE SPRINGING UP EVERYWHERE - The recent rain has moistened the soil, allowing the mushrooms spores to grow and spring up everywhere in many sizes and shapes. I would be afraid to eat any as I am not knowledgeable about them. I think of people we do not know that we are afraid of.



<u>2021 07-26, 5022 - A LATE JULY DAY ON THE MOUNTAIN</u> - I walked from the cabin in the warm afternoon sun to the top of the Lupine Field where the Mount Washington cooling wind chased away the mosquitos. It was perfect and I sat for a while on the bench realizing that every visit here is always perfect no matter what the season.



<u>2021 07-27, 5023 - A BEE AND A BUTTERFLY</u> - I recently took a photo of a bee and a butterfly looking for nectar on the same flowers. I found the combination interesting and thought about the thousands of photos I have taken over the years looking for combinations. Life itself is filled with combinations.



<u>2021 07-28, 5024 - BOLD AND BRASSY BEEBALM</u> - There are flowers that make bold and brassy statements with their blossoms such as beebalm and others that stay in the background. People can remind us of flowers. Some are bold and brassy while others are happier staying in the background of life.



<u>2021 07-29, 5025 - CAUSE AND EFFECT</u> - The recent western forest fires have caused the eastern part of the country's air to filled with a smoky, smelly haze. I think of the times Nature has reshaped the earth and how people are now contributing to the warming of the atmosphere. We can change our part.



<u>2021 07-30, 5026 - AN ASTER BOUQUET</u> - There is a small patch of asters in the Lupine Field in a place where the soil is thin, barely covering the granite ledge underneath. Its positive presence reminds me of groups of people drawn together to let their spiritual lights shine in places it is needed.

It is good for my internal nature, filling my heart with gratitude. Nature is not only around me but inside me.



We can always change the conditions in our mind to help grow positive actions.



2021 10-05, 5093 - A RAY OF FLOWER POWER IN AUTUMN - As the colors in the Lupine Field diminish there are still rays of bright yellow produced by the silent power of the still blooming flowers. I think of the positive power people have when they set positive intentions and gratitude in their hearts.



<u>2021 10-06, 5094 - THE TRAIL IS STILL GREEN</u> - Even though much of the landscape here in the mountains has begun to show color, the trail leading from the Lupine Field is still green. Just as the landscape changes at different rates, so does life, sometimes causing us to become disorientated when we think we know where we are.



<u>2021 10-07, 5095 - A FALL BLEND</u> - It seems as if every fall our senses become alive with the sights, sounds, tastes, smells, and feeling of autumn. 2021 10-09, 5097 - READY TO GO TO WORK - I hooked up the field mower to the Cat and towed it up the Mountain to cut the Lupine Field and the Orchard. I thought of what it must have been like a couple of hundred years ago without modern machinery and realized we still have the

pioneer spirit inside of us.



<u>2021 10-10, 5098 - SLEEP WELL</u> - The Lupine Field and the Orchard have been cut and readied for a long winter sleep. It is time for the new seeds to begin to take root. We hibernate ideas in our minds that can reawaken any time of year as they prepare to spring to life when we are ready for them.

energy flow.





throughout the landscape of life.





often very resilient.







You could see the red berries floating on the water before they were scooped up for waiting customers. I am fascinated with how people do things. Each one is a teacher for me to learn something new.



<u>2021 11-21. 5140 - MOON MAGIC</u> - I slept through the recent full moon eclipse, but when I did arise, I saw a magical scene just before the moon slipped behind the mountains. It shined through a single cloud and I hurried to capture the image. There is energy during a full moon that has an

effect on many people and animals.

<u>2021 11-23, 5142 - FUTURE TRAILS</u> - Every time we time log a portion of the land there is more than one purpose for removing trees. It provides the opportunity for new growth and new feed for the wild animals; it opens up views for people that walk or ski the land; and benefits many more than just ourselves.



<u>2021 11-24, 5143 - NATURE PAINTS THE SKY</u> - Nature is an incredible artist. Humans have attempted to capture Her creations since the beginning of time. Recently I observed a sky filled with layers of color which should encourage people to capture images in their own unique style.



<u>2021 11-25, 5144 - A SPECIAL BOUQUET FOR A SPECIAL DAY</u> - Today is Thanksgiving in this country, a day to be grateful for the past year as well as thoughts for the future. I recently captured a photo of the perfect bouquet for this special day. It was created by Nature as a reminder that each one of you is a special bouquet.



<u>2021 11-26, 5145 - CORDWOOD ROAD</u> - When wood was harvested in cordwood lengths, about four feet long, for paper manufacturing, loggers used wood to fill in wet places along the logging road. Now, the technique is still used with large timbers to protect the ground. We use similar techniques with our beliefs to help us cross difficult stretches.



2021 11-27, 5146 - YOU NEVER KNOW WHEN OR WHERE A HEART SIGN WILL APPEAR - I am always on the lookout for heart signs but I was not expecting one on my doughnut. I grabbed the camera and caught a picture before I ate it. Felt good in my heart and my stomach.



<u>2021 11-28, 5147 - COVERING THE RUTS</u> - I've learned a lot watching the loggers work, as I do from everyone I meet when they tell me about what and how they do things. I watched brush being hauled back into the woods to cover ruts made in the soft ground. It made it easier to use the same path.



<u>2021 11-29, 5148 - WAITING FOR SNOW</u> - It is almost December and we are still waiting for our first measurable snow fall. Sometimes it happens a month earlier and sometimes it could be in late December before it comes. Waiting is something we do for a good part of our lives. Often the result depends on how we wait for it.



<u>2021 11-30, 5149 - UPROOTED</u> - Years ago during a winter storm two giant pines were uprooted and remained in that position until loggers recently trimmed them. People often feel uprooted in life when situations change. Just as the soil will regenerate on the mountain, so will a person's life regenerate, only richer.



<u>2021 12-01, 5150 - THE PERFECT TREE</u> - Over the years we have searched for the perfect tree to decorate during the holidays. Now we just decorate with lights and have trees on the lawn we had intended to cut that have now grown too tall, so we get to see the perfect tree all year long. 

in thoughts and actions.




